

EDUCATION

STATE EDUCATE is State Theatre Company South Australia's long running and highly valued Education program. In 2022:

- 4,923 secondary students attended STCSA productions
- 37 Theatre skill and knowledge workshops were delivered to 528 students
- 2 week-long theatre intensives (Winter School and Summer School) were delivered for 25 participants
- Work Experience week saw 12 students spend a week learning about the various artistic and production parts of our theatre making
- The Flinders University Young Playwrights' Award received 12 entrants and the winning entrant received a public reading of their play
- Cathedral and Euphoria, two South Australian plays appealing to secondary students, were published by Currency Press
- Cathedral was presented to schools audiences in four outer metropolitan and five regional venues
- Over 100 tertiary students attended State Theatre Company South Australia rehearsals and masterclasses

State Theatre Company South Australia is committed to giving all South Australians the opportunity to share the experience of theatre. In 2022 we:


- Offered touch tours and audio described, captioned and audio enhanced performances

STATESIDE

State Theatre Company South Australia supports and showcases great local theatre companies as part of our Stateside program. In 2022, we supported *Kill Climate Deniers* by David Finnigan, presented by Kinetik Collective, as well as *Yes* by the Rabble, presented by The Rabble and Vitalstatistix.

Each company receives extensive marketing and production support from the new scheme, allowing local artists to tap into the extensive networks and resources the company has to offer.

STATE RESIDENT

Our State Resident program offers financial support and development time in our rehearsal room. In 2022, we supported companies and projects through our State Resident program through means including mentoring, in-kind rehearsal room hire and in-kind set and costume hire. The Company's program of commissioning new plays from emerging, mid-career and established writers and nurturing the creative development of new scripts to production is one of the nation's most successful.
