The State Educate production for the year is *Symphonie of the Bicycle*, a heartfelt production written and starring local talent, Hew Parham. This captivating show sees Hew performing all characters as he delves into the intricate world of cycling, exploring deep-seated passions and obsessions, and handling victory and loss.

We start the year featuring *The Children*, a thought-provoking exploration of three nuclear scientists grappling with the repercussions of a disaster. We also offer a delightful new romantic musical comedy, *The Questions*, an unexpected love story between two strangers navigating lockdown. We're especially thrilled to welcome back the extraordinary talent of Justine Clarke (*Girls & Boys*), who takes the stage in *Julia*, shedding light on the untold story of former Prime Minister, Julia Gillard. Finishing the year, we proudly present an adaptation of Peter Carey's award-winning novel, *Jack Maggs* in a Dickensian style noir thriller with a stellar South Australian cast.

Creativity, critical thinking and collaboration among students is promoted through their engagement with live theatre and interactions with artists. This cultivates a deeper understanding and appreciation of the arts. Through workshops, performances, and educational resources, we aim to ignite a lifelong passion for theatre and empower individuals to explore their artistic potential.

THE CHILDREN BY LUCY KIRKWOOD

The Children is set in an imagined future in a small coastal town in England. The play takes place in the aftermath of a disaster at a nuclear energy facility. Electricity and water are being rationed and an 'exclusion zone' has been established within the circumference of the facility.

Centering on the experiences of three retired nuclear scientists in their sixties, *The Children* grapples with the aftermath of the disaster and delves into the complex questions surrounding their roles in its creation and whether they must also participate in finding a resolution. This thought-provoking play explores themes such as moral responsibility, fidelity, loyalty, survival, and mortality.

THE QUESTIONS

BY VAN BADHAM (BOOK & LYRICS) AND RICHARD WISE (MUSIC & LYRICS)

She has a master's degree in Gender Studies. He thinks Jordan Peterson would make an ideal dinner guest. They both realise this blind date is doomed, but an outside catastrophe and "shelter in place" lockdown order forces these polar opposites into the longest first date ever. And the frustrated rock band rehearsing in the apartment next door is hardly helping them stay calm.

Inspired by the COVID-19 pandemic, *The Questions* is a rom-com edgy play with music. While in lockdown, the characters ask each other the "36 Questions that Lead to Love" a quiz originally crafted by psychologists in the 1990s, said to have the power to ignite love and intimacy between strangers. But are either of them ready for the answers?

Julia is an extraordinary new play featuring the remarkable talent of Justine Clarke (*Girls* & Boys). Here, she steps into the role of former Prime Minister, Julia Gillard, delivering an extraordinary performance that captures the essence of her life leading up to the iconic 'misogyny speech.'

In 2012, Australia witnessed an historic moment when its first female Prime Minister, Julia Gillard, delivered a speech that sent shockwaves around the world. Just over a decade later, one of Australia's most celebrated and internationally recognized playwrights, Joanna Murray-Smith, masterfully brings the untold human story behind that pivotal speech to the stage.

The story follows the enigmatic ex-convict Jack Maggs (Peter Carey's version of *Magwitch*) returning to London from Australia and embarking on a relentless quest to find his 'son' Henry Phipps. Maggs soon becomes entangled in the web of Phipps' neighbour, Percy Buckle and his bizarre household, where he makes a deal with young novelist and "mesmerist" Tobias Oates (or is it Charles Dickens himself?) to find Phipps. Oates has other plans though, and in Maggs, might just find the perfect inspiration for his new novel.

Guided by the skilful direction of former Artistic Director Geordie Brookman, *Jack Maggs* will take audiences on a strange and surprising slither around the Old Dart with a cavalcade of dazzling Dickensian characters all in search of the truth.

YOUTH WORKSHOP INTENSIVES

Winter School: 8 – 12 July Summer School: 2 – 5 Dec

State Theatre Company South Australia's holiday programs in the July and December school holidays provide a great opportunity for young people, ages 15-18, to deepen their knowledge and skills from recognised artists. These weeks are intensive skills-based weeks with the opportunity to devise new work or work on existing scripts toward a performance outcome.

WORK EXPERIENCE

Work Experience: 29 August - 1 September

Work Experience is held once per year for a small group of up to 15 South Australian secondary students only. The week will expose students to the intricacies of running a theatre company with tours of behind the scenes operations, sessions including Design, Wardrobe, Acting and Marketing. One person per school and regional students are encouraged. Note not all applicants will be successful.

FLINDERS UNIVERSITY THEATRE MAKERS AWARD

In conjunction with one of our Education Partners, Flinders University, State Theatre Company South Australia is delighted to announce this exciting new program designed to support and encourage young theatre makers. Designed for students in Stage 1 Drama, the award brings together students in a public performance of their work, enabling peers to observe their work in a tertiary setting and opening the door to performing arts tertiary study and careers. Winners receive a State Theatre Company South Australia subscription for the 2024 Season and special behind the scenes opportunities on a production.

ON-DEMAND STUDENT WORKSHOPS

Our on-demand student workshops are designed to bring theatre professionals into the classroom and present a tailored workshop to cover the current studies of the students. These workshops can be one-off or part of a series, cover a wide variety of topics and are held on-site at schools for the convenience of teachers and students. To arrange workshops please contact our Education Program Manager. Class sizes should be no more than 25 students per teaching artist.

Workshops can cover a broad range of topics, from Accent work, Acting, Brecht, Characterisation, Devising, Dramaturgy, Laban, Musical Theatre, Physical Theatre, Prop Making, Shakespeare, Verbatim and Vocal Work. Other workshops may also be available – to discuss and book contact our Education Program Manager.

TEACHER PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT WORKSHOPS

State Theatre Company South Australia offers the opportunity to gain professional development hours through workshops which will be scheduled throughout the year.

Teacher workshops will be held across the yearyou will be able to book via our website from mid Term 4.

TEACHER SUBSCRIPTIONS

Teacher Subscriptions can range between four and seven plays but must include four State Educate productions. Teachers are encouraged to attend Tangent Talk events and Subscriber Briefings to increase their professional development hours. Teacher Subscribers will receive a Certificate of Attendance for professional development towards the end of the year. This includes performances, Tangent Talks, Subscriber Briefings and the PD workshops.
