
Our 2018 season brings with it a renewed focus on this place, the beautiful, history laden, sometimes frustrating, always exciting state of

Paula, Dympie and Monika are, in the words of Roxette, Sweden's greatest export, "dressed for success". Primped, preened and ready to rumble, they are up for anything and, perhaps, anyone. Except that is for Stephen and Gordon, the alpha male and nerdy no-hoper at the table next to them.

Over the course of the night bad dance moves are on display, friendships are tested and the map of the human heart is crisscrossed. Jane Austen's masterpiece is a precision guided literary missile of wit and warmth. In playwright Kate Hamill she's found her theatrical match as verve and invention is brought to bear on the Dashwood's every move.

It's 1947 and two women in Port Pirie answer knocks at their doors. At one, a young Greek sailor who has jumped ship, looking for refuge. At the other, a man seeking a new life after being released from an internment camp for suspected fascists and Nazi sympathisers. But what do they really bring with them? And what exactly are they going to face when walking through these doors to a new life?

Inspired by the oral histories of Greek, Cypriot and Italian migrants to regional South Australia, this historical fiction explores the untold struggles embedded in the making of post World War II Australia. Featuring the formidable Rosalba Clemente (*The Seagull*) and Renato Musolino (1984, Othello) this multicultural drama in the spirit of Arthur Miller has been especially written for State Theatre Company South Australia by Greek Cypriot descendent Elena Carapetis.







What is a Subscription Package? A subscription package is a booking for four or more plays across our annual Season.

What's the difference between purchasing a subscription and buying tickets at other times during the Season?

The price! You'll save up to \$17 per ticket when you subscribe and only be charged one processing fee of \$6 per subscription. You'll also receive benefits including the best available seats in the house, invitations to exclusive events and behind-the-scenes updates.

How do I subscribe?

Its easy! Fill in the booking form in this brochure and mail it to: **State Theatre Subscriptions** C/O BASS **GPO Box 1269** Adelaide, SA 5001. You can also book online at statetheatrecompany.com.au

How can I ensure priority for my booking? Get your booking form in early. Booking forms are processed in order of receipt during the exclusive subscriber-only booking period. We receive a flood of forms from the moment our season is released. On Monday 4 December we release tickets to the general public; however, subscription forms are still given priority. For best seating availability, the earlier we receive your booking form the better.

When will I receive my tickets? Once your booking is processed BASS will post all your tickets to you for the entire Season. If you have selected performances within two weeks of your booking, those tickets will be available for collection at the venue Box Office before the performance.

What if I purchase a subscription and then can't attend a performance on the date I selected?

As a subscriber you get one free exchange of performance date or time each year. Subsequent exchanges attract an \$8.95 BASS fee per booking. All we ask is that you return your ticket to us at least five working days in advance of the original performance and nominate your preferred new performance date for that production.

If the new performance has a higher ticket price, you will need to pay the difference (sorry, no refunds for cheaper tickets or for failure to attend). Tickets cannot be exchanged after their booked performance.

How do I subscribe with a group of people? Book as a group of 10 and only pay for 9 Subscriptions! Send all your subscription forms together in the one envelope.

What if I am young, do I get a discount? You sure do. If you are under 30 years old you can buy a super cheap Under 30's Subscription. Tickets work out at just \$32 each. ID showing your birth date is required at the time of purchase, or a photocopy if making a postal booking.
