Crafting a season full of experience and adventure has, year on year, brought such happiness that it fills my heart to bursting. From all of us here at State Theatre Company, it is an incredible honour to be your storytellers. We hope you are swept away by each and every one.







SUBSCRIPTION PACKAGES

What is a Subscription package?

A Subscription package is a booking for 4 or more productions across Season 2019.

What's the difference between purchasing a subscription and buying individual tickets?

Value for money! You'll save up to \$17 per ticket when you subscribe and BASS will only charge one transaction fee of \$7 per subscription, rather than a fee per ticket. You'll also receive benefits including the best available seats in the house and behind-the-scenes access to State Theatre Company.

How do I subscribe?

Subscribe at statetheatrecompany.com.au or fill in the booking form in this brochure and mail it to BASS, GPO Box 1269, Adelaide SA 5001.

How can I ensure priority for my booking? And the best seats?

Book early! Subscription forms are processed in the order they are received during the exclusive subscriber booking period. Although we release performances to general sale on Monday 3 December, Subscription bookings are still given priority. The earlier we receive your booking form, the better the seating available.

When will I receive my tickets?

Once your booking is processed, BASS will post all your tickets to you for the entire Season. BASS process a large volume of Subscription forms after our Season launch, so please be patient. If you have selected performances within two weeks of your booking, those tickets will be available for collection at the venue box office before the performance.

What if I purchase a Subscription and then can't attend a performance on the date I selected?

Subscribers have one free exchange of performance date or time each year. Subsequent exchanges attract an \$8.95 BASS fee per booking. You will need to return your ticket at least 5 working days before the original performance and nominate your preferred new date. If the new performance has a higher ticket price, you will need to pay the difference. There are no refunds for cheaper tickets or failure to attend. Tickets cannot be exchanged after the performance for which they were originally booked. Please contact BASS on 8205 2200 for all exchanges.

How do I subscribe with a group of people?

Book as a group of 10 and only pay for 9 Subscriptions! Send all your Subscription forms together in the one envelope or call 08 8205 200.

What if I am young, do I get a discount?

You sure do! If you are under 30 years old you can buy a super cheap Under 30s Subscription. Tickets work out at just \$32 each. ID showing your birth date is required at the time of purchase, or a photocopy if making a postal booking.


